What's Wound Awareness Week all about?

Wounds Australia is the peak body for wound care and management in Australia. We run Wound Awareness Week every year to help raise awareness of the rising issue of wounds across Australia.

This year our Wound Awareness Week theme is *Let's Talk About Wounds*, and our goal is to get people talking about the rising issue of wounds. We are reaching out to you, as health care professionals, to help us spread awareness of what the wound warning signs are, who's at risk, and what someone should do if they have a wound that won't heal.

How can you help? It's simple.
